If you are planning on purchasing a Shorthorn bull this year, the Expo is where you need to be! That alone should say something about the depth and quality of this bull offering. The days are long past when you can buy a bull off the farm in June to turn in with your cows on July 1st. (It’s a fact, based on the number of calls we get in May and June looking for Shorthorn bulls.) You’ll want to plan ahead if you are planning to make a Shorthorn bull purchase and be in the seats or online on February 21. EXPO SCHEDULE

The “Friday Night Lights” auction on February 20 features elite frozen genetics including several Shorthorn lots of embryos and semen. The reception starts at 5 p.m. and the sale starts at 7 p.m. The Saturday sales start at 10 a.m. and the sale order has us as the third breed, so we are estimating the Shorthorn sale to start around noon or shortly thereafter. Both sales will be broadcast and offer online bidding on CCI.Live.

The Shorthorn and Shorthorn Plus divisions continue to be two of the largest divisions of steers and heifers represented in the program. While it is much the same program (juniors nominate their heifers and steers to collect points at sanctioned events for the show season and the program tracks participation and provides year end awards in multiple divisions), participants now pay a youth membership to Michigan Cattlemen’s Association. In addition, the program requires involvement in the educational contests and showmanship to be qualified to win top prizes. The “Michigan Bred” award offers breeders the opportunity to nominate calves they have bred and sold to compete in a special division. The Showcase Series is more than a lineup of shows – it’s a platform for youth to connect in the industry, learn valuable skills, and carry forward the legacy of excellence of the Michigan beef cattle business. 2026 Michigan Shorthorn State Show – Open Show at “Middle of the Mitten” on April 26

Plans are underway for the Michigan Shorthorn State Show to be held in conjunction with the Middle of the Mitten Show on Sunday, April 26 at Midland County Fairgrounds. This Open Show is for both youth and adults showing Shorthorn and ShorthornPlus in four divisions: Heifers, Steers, Bulls and Cow/Calf Pairs. All youth and adult exhibitors are invited to join Michigan Junior Shorthorn Association (MJSA) or Michigan Shorthorn Breeders Association (MSBA) via the the website: [michiganshorthorns.org](https://michiganshorthorns.org). Membership forms will also be available at check-in. In each show division, Michigan Shorthorn State Show awards will be presented to the highest-placing current members of MJSA or MSBA. The MJSA Showmanship Contest is open to MJSA members only; youth can join MJSA and enter the contest at check-in.
